Ranked Choice Voting: easy as 1-2-3!

This November 7, you'll vote for mayor, city council, Park Board, and Board of Estimate and Taxation using Ranked Choice Voting. There is no primary; RCV folds two elections into one, so you only have to make one trip to the polls in November. RCV was adopted in Minneapolis in 2006.

RANKED CHOICE OTING:
More choice. More power.

How you vote

- 1 Rank the candidates in order of preference on the ballot - 1, 2, 3, etc. The more you rank, the more power your ballot has.
- 2 Your second and third choices matter! But they will only be counted if your first choice is eliminated.
- 3 You are done! Know your vote will count the way you truly want it to.

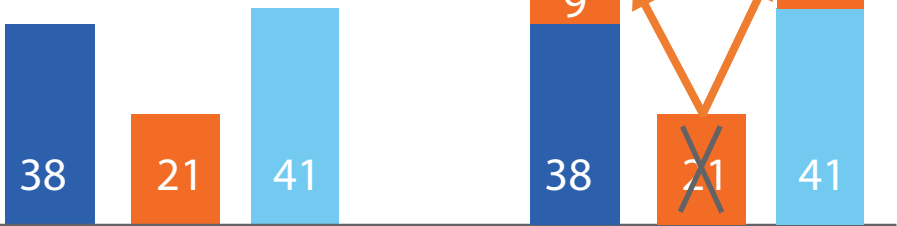
How your vote counts

Number of voters: 100 • Winning threshold: $100/2 + 1 = 51$ votes

No candidate reached the winning threshold.

The candidate with the fewest votes is eliminated and votes are reallocated. Light blue wins!
