## Ranked Choice Voting: easy as 1-2-3!

This November 7, you'll vote for mayor using Ranked Choice Voting. There is no primary; RCV folds two elections into one, so you only have to make one trip to the polls in November. RCV was adopted in St. Paul in 2009 and is used for city council and mayoral races, but not school board.

# How you vote

- 1 Rank the candidates in order of preference on the ballot - 1, 2, 3, etc. The more you rank, the more power your ballot has.
- 2 Your second and third choices matter! But they will only be counted if your first choice is eliminated.
- 3 You are done! Know your vote will count the way you truly want it to.

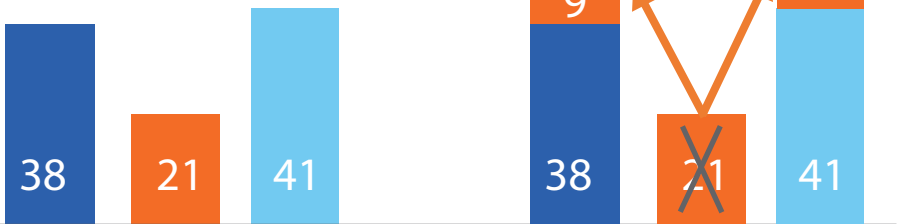
## How your vote counts

Number of voters: 100 • Winning threshold:  $100/2 + 1 = 51$  votes
